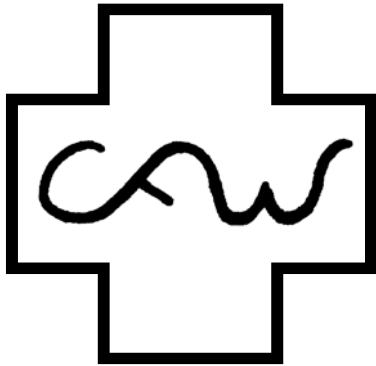

Welcome to Camp Ft. Worth 2010

Enclosed is all the information you will need to register your group for Camp Ft. Worth this summer.

Who can come to CFW

- Students who have **completed** the 9th grade (and be 15 years old by September 30 of current year) through graduated seniors.
- Students can attend camp only **once** as a camper.

We ask each parish/school to send a group of 5-10 students. For every 5 students one adult. This means that if you have 1-5 students bring one adult and if you have 6-10 students bring 2 adults. (**Limit of 10** students per parish/school per camp)

Important:

Because of the high demand for this camp, and the limited space available, we do not allow groups to "reserve" spots and give names, forms, and money at a later date. Parishes/schools must register as a group. Your registration is guaranteed only when the electronic registration form and money have been turned in for the **entire** group.

Team Retreat June 25-27 (Optional but encouraged for adults)

July 18-23 Notre Dame Wichita Falls

Team Retreat July 16-18 (Optional but encouraged for adults)

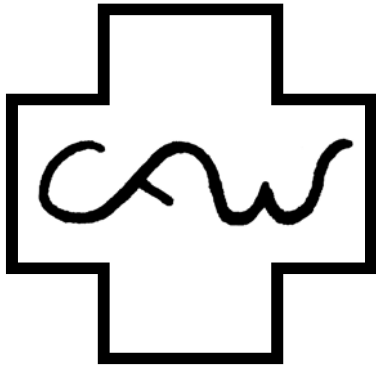

Steps for Successful Registration:

Change for this year

1. Read through **all** the information enclosed.
2. Decide which camp(s) you will attend. (**limit 10** students per parish/school per camp)
3. Distribute forms to youth and other adults.
4. Gather \$100.00 per youth (Adults do not pay.)
Make **ONE check** payable to Camp Ft. Worth.
Any youth who can't pay \$100.00 contact Jeff, scholarship money is available.

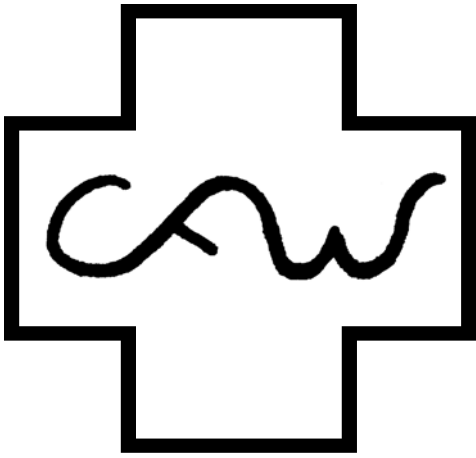
Once you have all the forms and money gathered do these things:

4. **Arrange for the meal your parish/school will provide** for Camp: Every group that sends a group must provide either a breakfast or a dinner so be sure and call to volunteer your help. We do this so the camp experience goes beyond the students and to keep the cost of camp down Lunch will be provided by Camp Ft. Worth. ** Consider inviting a parish group (Knights of Columbus Alter society etc) to provide the meal**
5. **Make copies** of the Form A and Form B (We need two at camp to be sure each camper has their forms with them at all times)

Basic info

When - There are two sessions of Camp.

June 27-July 2 St. Vincent de Paul Arlington

July 18-23 Notre Dame Wichita Falls

Who - Incoming 10th grader (age 15 or older) thru Graduated Senior.

Also students can attend camp only once as a camper.

No youth can attend on their own.

Cost - \$100.00

What exactly is it: Each participant will be placed in group of about 12 youth and adults. Each group will travel to a different work site each day. We strive to spend a day working in these areas: One day each with organizations that serve the homeless, at risk children, and the elderly, as well a day in a workshop making baby cribs and a day at the "home" church site (doing odd jobs).

Showers - Since the place we stay may not be equipped with shower facilities for a group our size we will shower in the afternoon after working either at a school, the Y.M.C.A. or at a shelter.

Meals - Every parish/school that sends a group must provide either a breakfast or a dinner. We do this so the camp experience goes beyond the students and to keep the cost of camp down Lunch is provided by Camp Ft. Worth.

Camp Ft. Worth is a mission trip/summer camp/retreat experience that is co-sponsored by St. Bartholomew Catholic Church and the Office of Youth Ministry and Adolescent Catechesis for the Diocese of Ft. Worth. Camp Ft. Worth builds the Kingdom of God while drawing you closer to Him. The Father loves and He sends. He Loved the world so much He sent His Son Jesus. Camp Ft. Worth is a place where His *love, sends YOU!* Come to Camp Ft. Worth and experience the Fathers love as you never have before.

You will experience the love of the Father in the person of His Son Jesus through the power of the Holy Spirit in a profound way through

- ⇒ Service work
- ⇒ Daily Mass
- ⇒ Friendships made
- ⇒ Prayer time
- ⇒ Praise and Worship
- ⇒ Contact with the poor of our diocese.

Jesus said the poor would always be with us. He also sends us to their aide. Camp Ft. Worth is a small effort to raise awareness to the plight of the poor in our diocese and to encourage youth to add service to the poor of the world to their lifestyle as Catholic Christians.

Why is it called "Camp Ft. Worth"

The camp is not named for the city of Ft. Worth, rather it is named for the diocese.

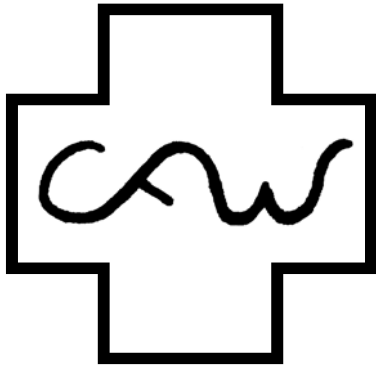
Because the "Local Church" is the Diocese of Ft. Worth and this camp seeks to serve the whole diocese.

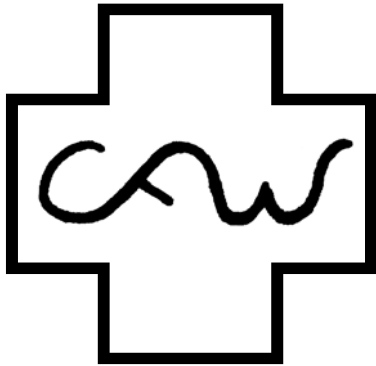

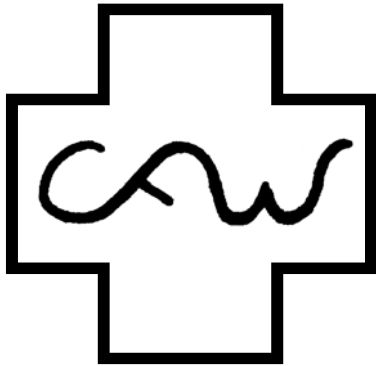

Note to parents:

At Camp Ft. Worth your child will be placed in a small group that will travel to a different work site each day. Their adult small group leader will accompany them each day and there will be an additional adult at each work site.

In case of emergency we will follow these procedures:

1. Take immediate action for the safety of your child.
2. Call you at the numbers you provide on the registration form.
3. Upon arrival at the hospital or urgent care facility one of the people who you have given permission to consent to emergency medical or surgical treatment (on the Form B) will work with the doctors to arrange the appropriate treatment. (In contact with you at the phone numbers provided in the release forms, if available, or with out you if you can not be reached)

The people listed on the "Consent To Participate/Consent For Emergency Treatment" form (Form B) will not necessarily be the people that are with your child every minute of day at Camp Ft. Worth. They will however be reachable and in the event of an emergency, will be contacted by your Childs small group leader and will meet the leader and your child at the hospital or urgent care facility.

GUIDELINES FOR ADULT CHAPERONES & ADULT LEADERS

An **Adult Chaperon** (A-dult) is someone who is 21 years old or older

An **Adult Leader** (B-dult) is someone out of high school who is between 18-20 years old

As an adult chaperon/leader, you set an example for the young people who are participating in Camp Ft. Worth. The ratio for adult chaperones/leader to youth is 1 adult for every 5 youth.

As an adult chaperone/leader you must agree to the following list of responsibilities and guidelines. Please check off each one after you have read it to insure that you fully understand your role in Camp Ft. Worth.

- You are responsible for their behavior of the youth you bring throughout the Camp.
- Adult chaperones are responsible for helping enforce the Camp Code of Behavior and should use the "Code" as a guide for their own behavior.
- Adult chaperones/leaders will make arrangements each day to check in with their young people..
- You are expected to be at Camp all week long (no coming and going from Camp).
- You are expected to spend each night at Camp.
- Adult chaperones/leaders must review the Code of Conduct and sign it too.
- Each parish/school group leader should have their own medical first-aid kit for their groups use
- All adult participants are expected to refrain from drinking alcoholic beverages for the duration of the Camp, as well as, during their travels to and from the Camp.
- The possession or use of illegal drugs by any individual will not be tolerated.
- If an adult chaperone/leader must go into a sleeping room with youth, especially of the opposite sex, a second adult chaperone must be present with them.
- During all Camp activities, and especially social activities, adult chaperones/leaders must be available in the building where the activity takes place.

Adult leader section (in addition to the above):

- Adult leaders are to assist the Chaperon in leading the parish/school group.
- Adult leaders should use the Camp Code of Behavior as a guide for their own behavior.
- Adult leaders are not to discipline students, they should take discipline issues to the chaperone
- Adult leaders can not drive students.

Camp Ft. Worth Code Of Behavior

Welcome to the Camp Ft. Worth! Please offer your appreciation to the people of our host parish for the welcome they offer us. Remember you are representatives of a respected Catholic youth organization. We expect you will represent your parish, school, and diocese well during these six days. Recall that you are a witness for your church/school to all who will attend the camp; we ask you to project an image of Christian consideration, sensitivity, and respect to everyone and to the property around you. We are confident you will display the maturity, responsible leadership and character, which have become the trademark qualities of Catholic youth. Thank you!

Parish/school group leaders are responsible for the actions of the members of their group. Each parish/school accepts full responsibility for any damage or theft caused by members of their group while attending the camp. Adult chaperones in each delegation are to help enforce the Code of Behavior (the Code) and to set an example for their youth.

Check the box as you read the rules

- Participants must attend all camp activities. Name badges must be worn at all time in order to gain admission to camp events.
- Participants are expected to remain at camp for the entire week. If you must leave for some reason you must have pre approved permission from your parents and your parish leader.
- Socializing prior to curfew should be done in the public assigned areas. Remember to keep noise levels down in the sleeping areas; especially later in the evenings. This guarantees the right to privacy and quiet times for fellow camp attendees and other guests in the dormitories. All participants must be in their dorm rooms by curfew on each night of the camp. No visiting is permitted in dorm rooms occupied by members of the opposite sex.
- All participants must refrain from drinking. The purchase, possession, or consumption of beer, wine or other alcoholic beverages by minors and the possession or use of illegal drugs by any individual will not be tolerated. Failure to comply with these rules will mean immediate dismissal from the camp. Participants of legal drinking age are expected to comply with this rule.
- No weapon of any kind may be possessed by a camp participant.
- All should refrain from using foul language and the use of "negative" or off-color (dirty) humor. Also, no derogatory remarks should be made in regards to: age, gender, race, appearance and other offensive subjects. Lastly, no actions that belittle, sexually harass, or humiliate another person will be tolerated. Remember all people have dignity given them by the creator our Father, and through the work of His Son being human.

PARENT: I agree that my child shall abide by all rules and regulations as outlined in the Camp Ft. Worth Code of Behavior (the "Code"). I understand it is my duty to have reviewed the Code and explained it to my child prior to signing this form. I agree that if my child fails to abide by the Code or engages in any infraction of the Code whatsoever, that my child can be immediately dismissed from the Camp and sent home immediately at my expense for the immediate transportation home with no right of reimbursement for any amount in connection therewith.

I fully understand the consequences of the foregoing statements and sign this Camp Ft. Worth Code form knowingly, freely, and willingly. **(Your signature must appear below or your child will not be permitted to attend the camp.)**

What to Bring

- Bible
